

The Central Government Program on Emission Reduction

Indonesia has committed to 26-41 percent CO₂ emission reduction target by 2020

“We are devising an energy mix policy including LULUCF (*Land Use, Land Use Change, and Forestry*) that will reduce our emissions by **26 percent by 2020** from BAU (*Business As Usual*). With international support, we are confident that we can reduce emissions by as much as **41 percent.**”




How to achieve that?

- Suspension on all new concessions for conversion of **peat and natural forest**. → **Moratorium map**
- Establish a **degraded lands database**, to facilitate the establishment of economic activity on such lands rather than converted peatland or natural forests. → **Indicative Map for utilization of forest in Production Forest**
- Enforce existing laws against illegal logging and trade in timber and related forest crimes and set up a special unit to tackle the problem. → **Timber Legality Assurance System**
- To address land tenure conflicts and compensation claims.
→ **Join regulation: MHA, MoF, Public Works and Land Agency.**


Moratorium map

- **President's Instruction** No. 10/2011- No. 6/2013:
POSTPONING NEW PERMIT AND IMPROVING GOOD FOREST GOVERNANCE ON PRIMARY NATURAL FOREST AND PEATLANDS.
 - For 2 (two) years and can be extended
 - **With exception** for implementation of vital national development, namely: **geothermal, oil and gas, electricity, land for rice and sugar cane.**

REDD+ Implementation

- All REDD+ activities happen at **site level** (*'tapak'*) which particularly occur at **Forest Management Unit (FMU)**.
- Forest Management Unit Development:
 - Establishment of FMU Area
 - Establishment of FMU Institutional
 - Forest Management Planning

FMU → Good forest governance

- Development and improvement of FMU for the entire forest area is a "**point of no return**", as an effort to increase the '**good forest governance**'.
- FMU is at the core of which is a partnership with the community to achieve sustainable forest management with the principle of '**mutual symbiotic**'.
