



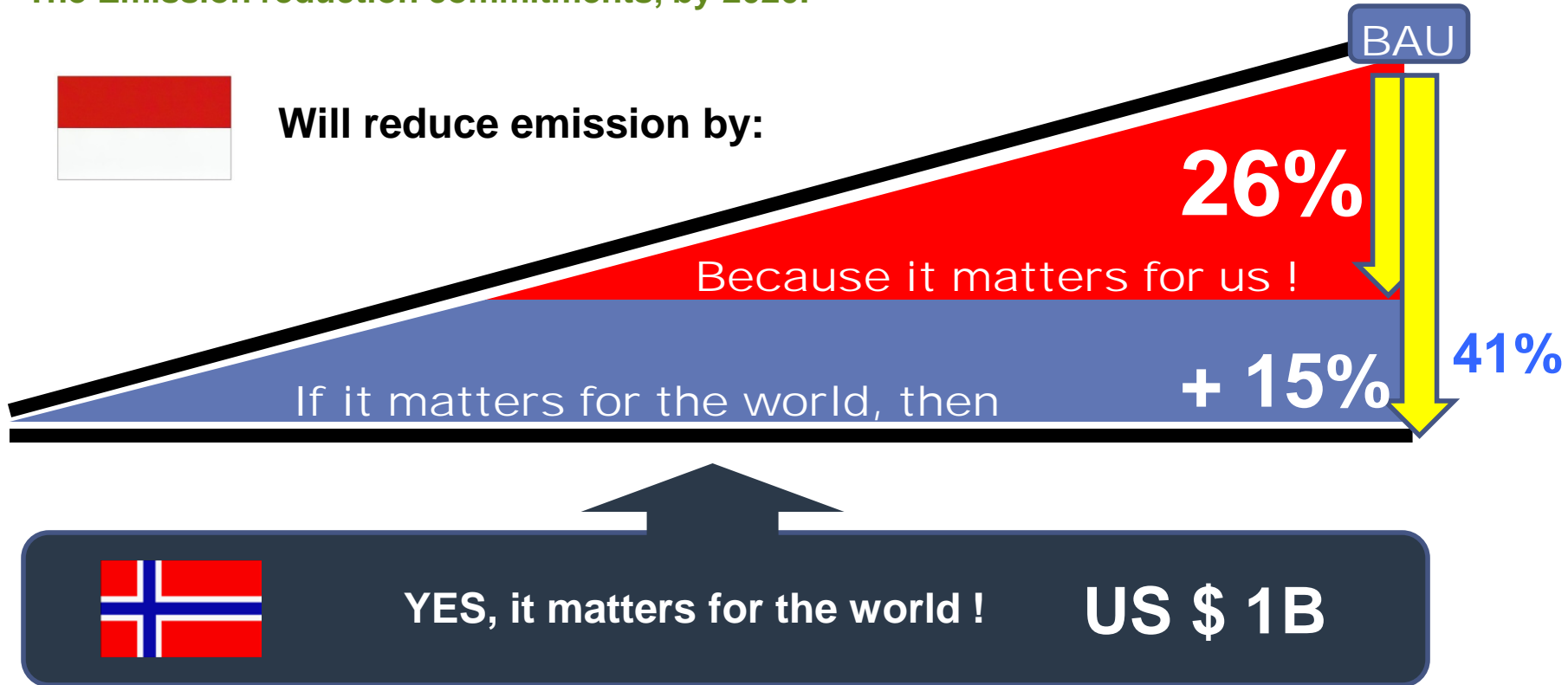

The Emission reduction commitments, by 2020.



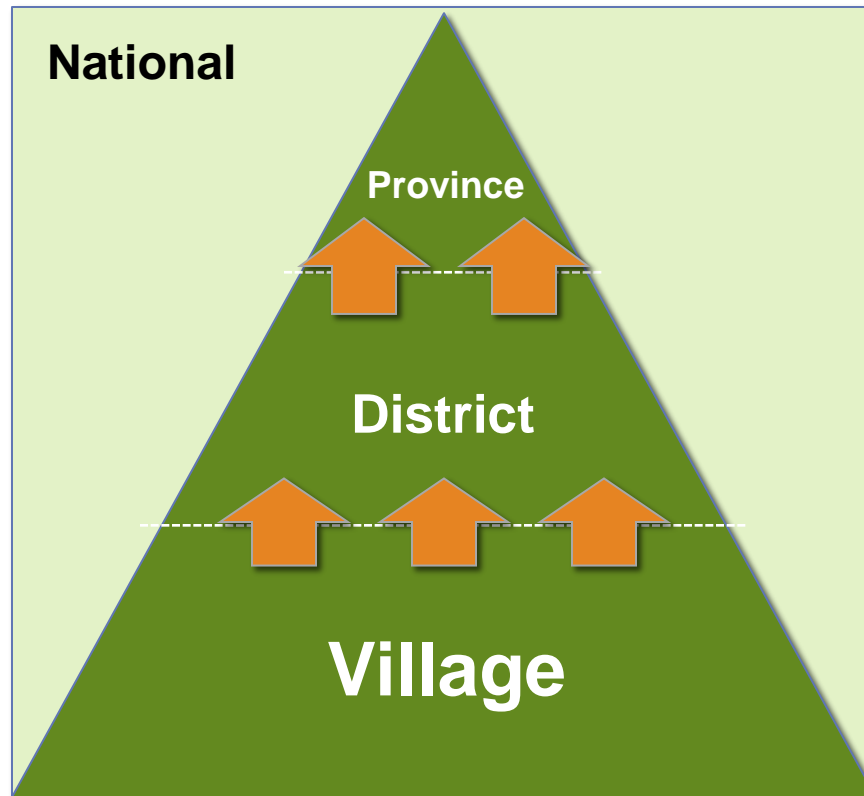
In May 2010, Indonesia signed a **Letter of Intent (LOI)** with Norway : an impactful political support to Indonesia's commitment to reduce emission by 41%, of which 83% will come from REDD+.

Basically with a **Payment for Result** approach

Institutionally & Operationally Ready from the ground up



National readiness through bottom-up sub-national implementations.

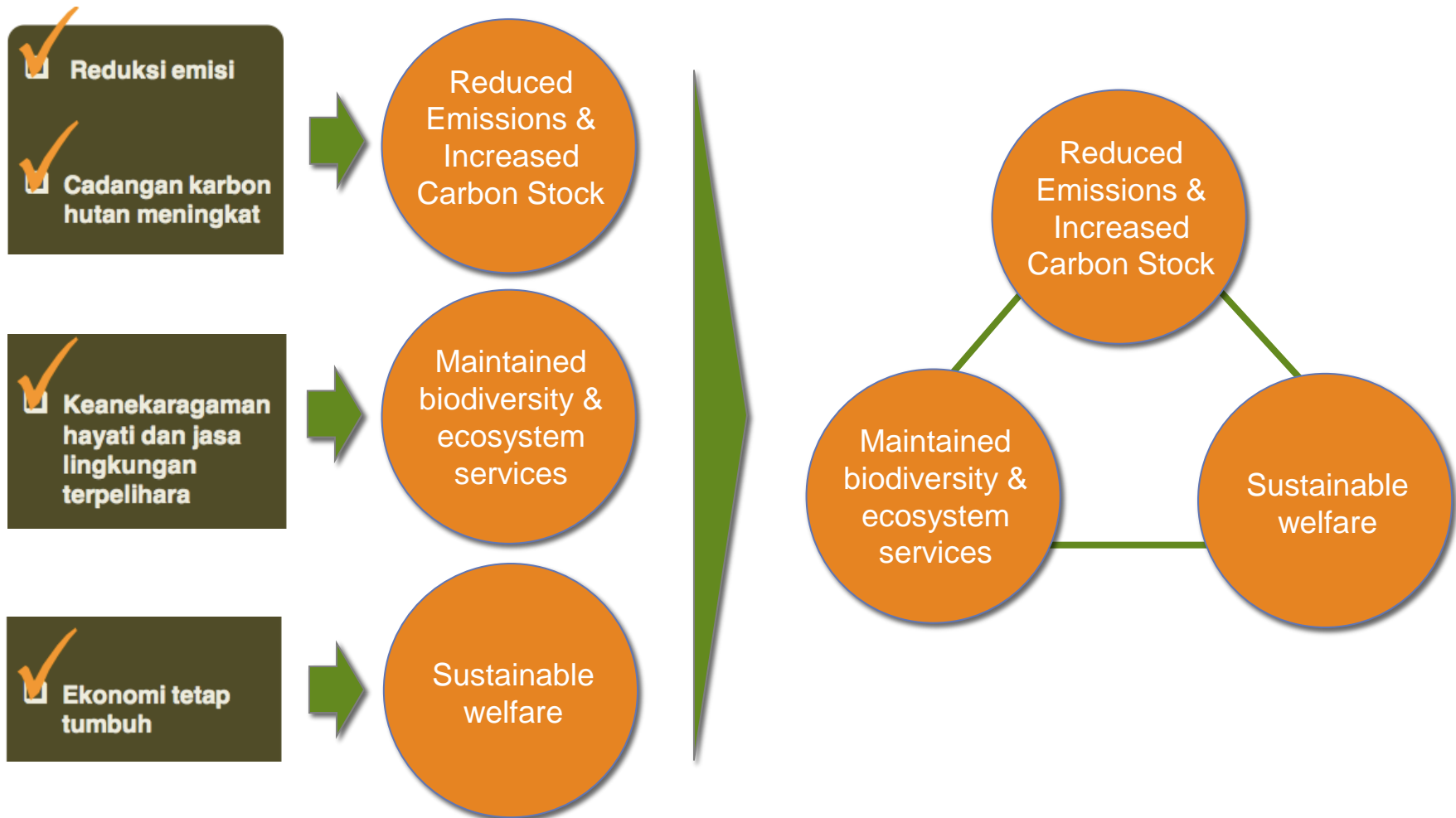


The REDD+ Strategic Framework

Translating the 4 objectives as our KPIs



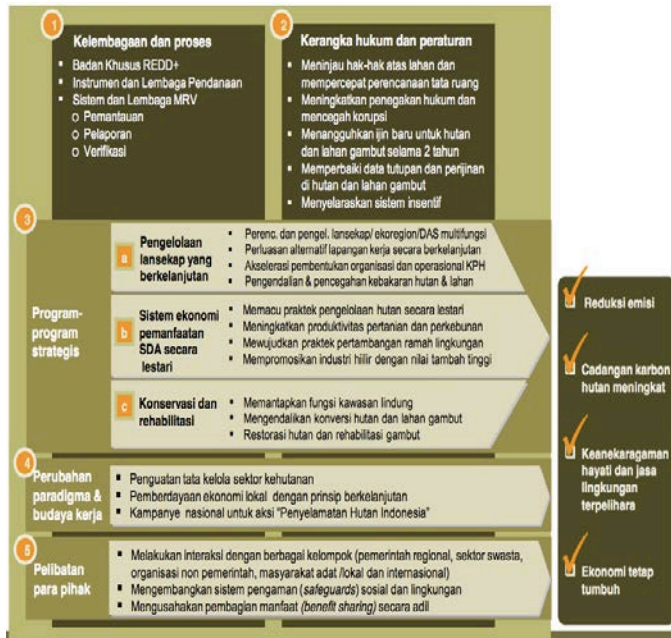
Sustainable implementation of REDD+ requires enablement of various elements

Paradigm and culture change is the core element to sustainable REDD+ implementations. Successful implementation of enabling elements will ensure success implementation of the 3 KPIs.

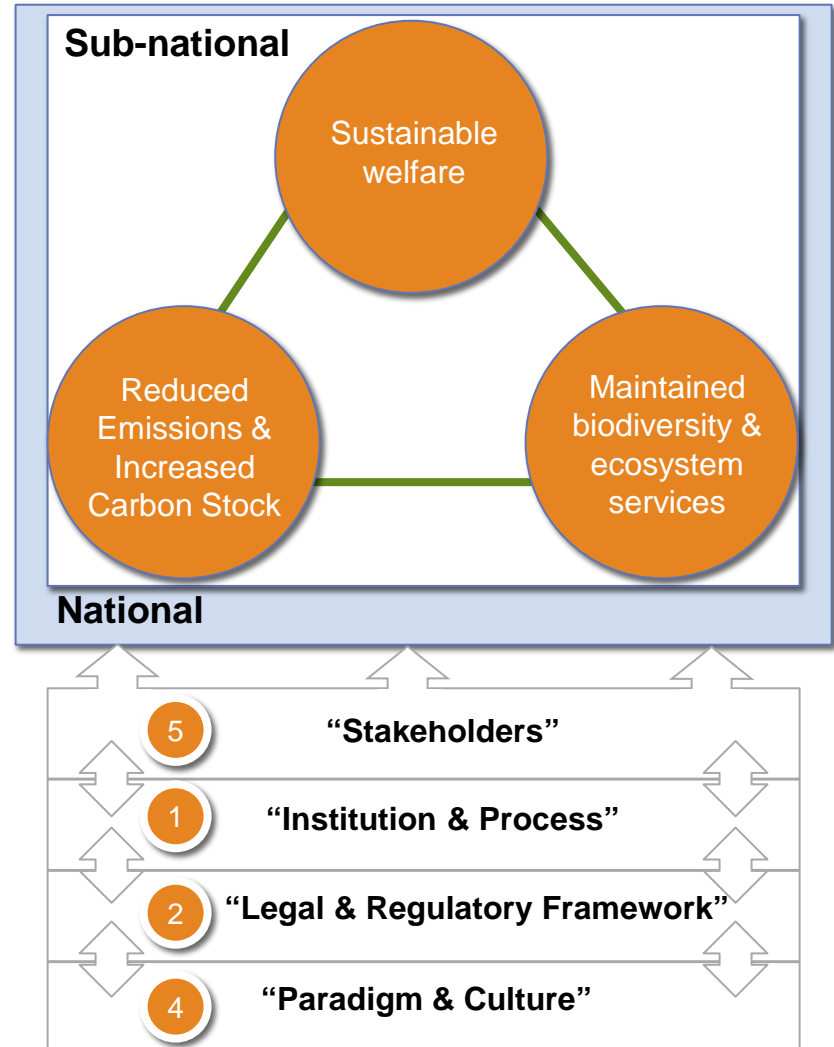


The REDD+ Indonesia KPIs

In implementing REDD+ in Indonesia, the three KPIs are interdependently linked while the enabling elements are implemented to ensure success of the 3 KPIs.



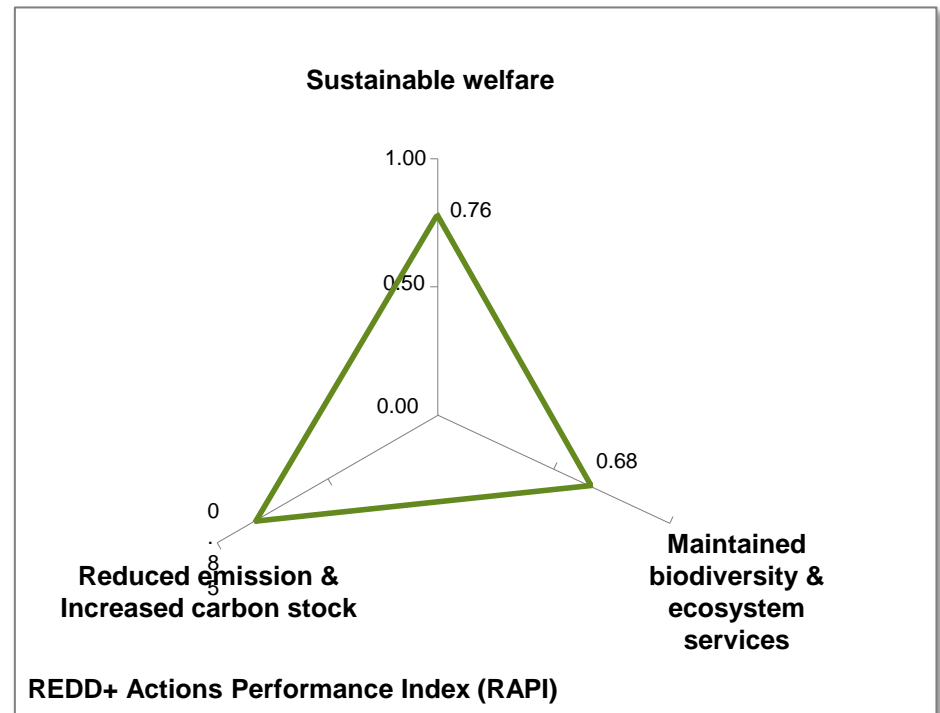
REDD+ Actions Performance Index (RAPI)



Achieving a “balanced” REDD+ Triangle

Aiming for a “balanced” triangle will produce effective and sustainable REDD+ results.

A “balanced” triangle, means that we achieve **sustainable welfare**, while meeting our **emission reduction** commitments and **increase of carbon stock**, and **maintaining the biodiversity and ecosystem services** of the forests and peat lands.
