

# 2022 Santa Barbara TRES

Prescribed Fire Training Exchange  
November 12 – 19, 2022



**WHO:** Land managers, fire professionals, tribal members, community members interested in the use of prescribed fire, researchers and students.

**WHEN:** Saturday, Nov. 12 – Saturday, Nov. 19, 2022

**WHERE:** TNC Jack and Laura Dangermond Preserve & UCSB's Sedgwick Reserve, Santa Barbara County

**2022 Santa Barbara TRES firefighters will engage in 8 days of burning** on breath-taking lands, learning and working alongside professional fire practitioners, tribal partners, land managers, and community members to meet diverse objectives with "Good Fire."

**SB TRES seeks to build capacity for community based burning** by promoting the ecological health of diverse Santa Barbara landscapes (Oak woodlands, Coastal prairies, Coastal shrublands), while meeting cultural, training and wildfire mitigation outcomes.

**Firefighters of varying experience will collectively work on** a range of Rx fire skills and taskbooks, from holding and firing operations, to unit preparation and mop-up, to taking on leadership training assignments. We will be collectively sharing knowledge, experience, and resources to build local relationships and increase regional capacity to safely utilize fire as a land management tool.

**Requirements:** Participants must be qualified **Basic Wildland Firefighter NWCG FFT2**, or have completed the online courses (S130, S190, L180, ICS 100b, IS 700 and a Work Capacity Test) and can attend the one day training on the first day of the TRES.

**Signing up:** Registration fee is \$150. Scholarships are available upon request or fees can be waived if bringing apparatus or rare skill sets. Applications are competitive, and as such priority will be given to regionally based participants, tribal members and those bringing equipment.
